


# City of Boulder City

Public Works has begun a major project to replace street signs throughout the community. The signs will follow the design developed in conjunction with the Community Development Department several years ago. The new signs will meet reflectivity requirements and move the City toward standardization of our signage. Zone 1 is complete. Zone 2 should be complete by the end of May. Zone 3 will utilize funding in the next fiscal year (after July 1).


