Historic Preservation Award for 2012

The Boulder City Historic Preservation Committee has determined that the Boulder City Historic Preservation Award for 2012 is hereby granted to:

Boulder Bowl at 504 California Avenue

in recognition of the tasteful and comprehensive renovation of this 1940's era building located within the Boulder City Historic District as listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Boulder Bowl was chosen for this award because the renovation incorporated the following attributes:

- The façade was restored with materials matching the original and enhanced with the installation of a substantial, rod suspended canopy which provides welcome shade for patron seating and pedestrians.
- Graphically the exterior features an indirectly lighted, cheerful and colorful retro logo, the restored iconic projecting bowling pin sign, as well as delightful murals painted by a local artist.
- The interior renovation provided for accessible restrooms, food and beverage area enhancements, refurbished materials, replacement of utilities and the addition of large historically rooted murals.

With all of the above contributing, the Boulder Bowl shall continue to provide the Historic District and community with the opportunity for new memorable and fun experiences, as it has for past generations.


