Boulder City Historic Preservation Award for 2017

The Boulder City Historic Preservation Committee has determined that the Boulder City Historic Preservation Award for 2017 is hereby granted to the:

Sundial Park Walkway Reconstruction 620 Nevada Way

in recognition of the detail-oriented replacement of the flagstone walkways at this 1930's era park located within the Boulder City Historic District as listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Sundial Park Walkway Reconstruction was chosen for this award because the renovation incorporated the following attributes:

- The original deteriorating flagstone walkway was replaced with new red flagstone so similar that it is difficult to discern that the flagstone is not original.
- The Boulder City Public Works Department reached out to request the input of the City's Historic Preservation Committee and then followed through with the Committee's recommendation to use flagstone to replace the walkway, rather than a less expensive and less appropriate alternative for this historic park.
- The new walkways meet requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act while maintaining the historic character and charm of the original walkways. To that end it is a valuable benefit to the historic district.




