City Budget Process Underway



Monday, March 18, Boulder City residents learned more about the projected financial standing based on budgeted revenues and expenditures for Fiscal Year 2020 during a workshop at the Senior Center. The budget includes thirteen new hires that will bring outsourced services under our roof and a \$1.7 million reserve which can be used towards general fund or Capital Improvements as decided by Council. Department Directors and staff utilized the goals set forth in the Strategic Plan to meet

these objectives. "We sat down with each department director to review the budgets and determine if the funding requests were feasible and appropriate. We were reflective, requiring each department to review the way we deliver services and build efficiency and effectiveness in their processes and programs," said Al Noyola, City Manager. "Directors had to ensure a budget neutral impact to the fullest extent possible." Several new positions in the FY 2020 budget allows the city to handle more work in-house, saving money and maximizing our ability to handle grant administration and construction management. State law requires that the Tentative Budget be submitted to the Department of Taxation by April 15, 2019, and that the Final Budget be approved by May 31, 2019.
