Public Service Recognition Week**

BOULDER CITY – They protect us through law enforcement and responding to fires and accidents; provide us justice through the courts and beautify our landscape through amazing parks; manage our vital records, make sure we can vote and so much more. But often, the work of our public servants goes unrecognized. The week of May 5-11, 2019 is designated by the President and Congress as Public Service Recognition Week (PSRW).

PSRW has been celebrated since 1985 during the first full week in May. It is a time to honor those who serve our nation as federal, state, county, and local government employees. Public Service Recognition Week highlights the accomplishments of the dedicated public servants who work tirelessly on behalf of all Americans and who rarely get the credit they deserve.

Banners will be placed in front of the larger city facilities during the week-long celebration, and storyboards describing the work of each department will be displayed inside buildings. Boulder City's social media accounts will also recognize employees, utilizing a hash tag of **#PSRW**.

There is also a Proclamation that Boulder City Mayor Rod Woodbury has signed to recognize staff. "City Council and I are always proud to recognize the dedicated, hard-working employees of Boulder City," said Mayor Woodbury. "It is especially meaningful to celebrate alongside the many current and retired local, state and federal employees who call Boulder City home."
