Thursday will be a holiday for most City of Boulder City employees. City Hall will be closed in celebration of the nation's Independence Day. Kicking off this year's July 4 celebration will be the annual Rotary Pancake Breakfast at 7 a.m. in Bicentennial Park. The Damboree parade will begin at 9 a.m. at the intersection of Colorado Street and Nevada Way. It will continue down Nevada Way to Fifth Street and on Fifth Street to Avenue B. The parade will end at Avenue B and 6th St. in Broadbent Memorial Park. The theme for this year's parade is "I ♥ BC." Trophies to the winning parade entries will be awarded at 11 a.m. in Broadbent Park. Festivities there include a flag-raising ceremony, food booths and games. Events will start at 4 p.m. at Veterans'

Memorial Park leading up to the 9 p.m. fireworks show. Food, games and music by DJ Mike Pacini will take place throughout the day. Have a safe holiday!

## Fireworks: Safety Should Always be Key



Although some "safe and sane" fireworks are allowed from June 28 through July 4, there are still plenty of warnings to go with them. According to Clark County Fire officials, only fireworks labelled "safe and sane" are legal to use. All fireworks are prohibited on federal land, including the Lake Mead National Recreation Area. No fireworks of any kind are allowed before June 28 nor after midnight on July 4.
