Avery Receives National Honor For Work Protecting The Community

Bill Avery, an 11-year veteran with the Boulder City Police Department, has earned national recognition for his efforts to inform the community about sex offenders who live in the area.

He is one of only 50 law enforcement members to receive the National Award for Excellence in Sex Offender Registry Management. The honorees were selected by OffenderWatch from more than 15,000 law enforcement personnel in more than 3,000 agencies throughout the country. OffenderWatch is the largest sex offender registry in the United States.

Avery received the award Sept. 10.

"The sex offender registry department is a priority in Boulder City, and that has allowed Avery and the entire department to go above and beyond what is required in statute. Avery and the staff work very hard to collect comprehensive data on every offender in their jurisdiction so that the public has all of the information necessary to protect themselves," said Mike Cormaci, president of OffenderWatch.

"We're fortunate to have such a dedicated, committed staff, and Bill regularly goes that extra step to help the public," said Police Chief Tim Shea. "His efforts are greatly appreciated by the police officers who serve this community."
