B. Verbal report from Parks and Recreation Director, Roger Hall, on maintenance issues and playability at the Municipal Golf Course

Manager, Julie Calloway, presented Director Roger Hall's report regarding maintenance issues and playability at the Municipal Golf Course. The report stated the Boulder City Municipal Golf Course is in great shape and has been receiving a lot of play. She explained that the current maintenance contract with Turf Tech is expiring in June of 2021. She said that Director Hall is going to the City Council meeting on January 26, 2021 with two golf course maintenance options. The first would be an RFP for a maintenance contract structured like the existing contract. The second option would be to amend Golf Professional Andy Schaper's current contract to include the labor expense for maintenance of the courses. The City is recommending option two to provide financial savings and overall transparency with the contract.

Member Carla Morgan asked if we have had in house maintenance before. Manager Calloway stated yes, but that it has been a while. In addition, Member Morgan asked about the status of disc golf at Boulder Creek Golf Course. Manager Calloway stated that disc golf has been limited due to the increase of golf rounds during Covid. Member Mike Pontius asked if golf report figures were only the Municipal Golf Course. He also mentioned that he was also pleased that the golf rates increased and asked why they didn't go up even more for nonresidents. Manager Calloway explained that the reports only include the Municipal Golf Course. She also said that the rates went up approximately \$5 per round across the board.

- B. Verbal report from Recreation Coordinator, Jennifer Spinkelink, on the status of special interest classes, special events, youth center, and art center

Manager, Julie Calloway, presented a report from Recreation Coordinator, Jennifer Spinkelink. The report stated that safekey has about 5 kids a day. She shared that the safekey staff has been assisting at the Smith Building vaccine center. She explained that the art center is closed until the pause is over and the youth center is closed until school is back in session. The fitness center is operating at 25% capacity and appointments are required. She reported that the fitness center has been doing a great job training their patrons to call for appointments and pay over the phone. Manager Calloway also reported that we have a few classes that are operating outside during the pause including Horseback Riding, Tai Chi, Functional Fitness, and Bootcamp. She shared that the Tiny Tots program is still very active. Member Katie Tyler asked if safekey hours will be expanded and Manager Calloway replied, not at this time due to lack of demand and staffing.

- C. Verbal report from Recreation Sports Coordinator, Kelly Lehr, on the status of youth and adult sports

Manager, Julie Calloway, presented a report from Sports Coordinator Kelly Lehr. The report stated that in December, the youth flag football program ended. She explained that the sports department received approval for flag football from the state and the participants were able to enjoy six games before the end of the season. They finalized youth coed volleyball in December as well and explained that this was the first time for this league but hopefully not the last. Manager Calloway said that youth and adult basketball was cancelled for the winter season since no indoor sports are permitted. She said that indoor pickleball was discontinued in December due to the Governor's pause directive. The Boulder Dam Credit Union has renewed their sponsorship of the local pickleball club and as soon as the pause is lifted, we will continue gym times for this popular club. Currently, youth sports is offering an outdoor hockey program in pods for kindergarten through second grade children. They are ten 45-minute sessions that are conducted like an instructional camp or a physical education class. Finally, Manager Calloway informed the members that the sports department is submitting plans to the state seeking approval for adult softball and an over the line tournament.

- D. Verbal report from Parks and Recreation Manager, Julie Calloway, on the status of Parks and Recreation Administration

Manager Julie Calloway informed the members that most staff time is currently working to set up vaccination appointments for the Boulder City residents. She explained that the Parks and Rec staff has really stepped up and helped in any way necessary. She said that staff is working at the Smith Clinic and is working extra hours over the weekend to help in the vaccination roll out process. She said that with the current supply and demand issues, staff is taking contact information to notify residents when vaccine appointments become available. Manager Calloway also reported briefly about upcoming budget meetings planning for the next fiscal year.

Manager Calloway mentioned an upcoming project at the Skate Park. Member Pontius asked about additional pickle ball courts and Manager Calloway stated that at this time there are no additional courts due to current budget restraints. Member Morgan asked about paying for activities online and Manager Calloway stated that online registration is in the works.

- B. Verbal report from Aquatic Coordinator Cheree Brennan on classes, special events, and maintenance issues at the swim pool complex.

Aquatic Coordinator, Cheree Brennen, discussed pool attendance. Coordinator Brennen stated that Racquet Ball and Wallyball have been closed since November. She said they have two new lifeguards but could use more along with needing swim instructors. She stated that swim classes have been going well and the water aerobics numbers have been steady. Coordinator Brennan shared information about the Buddy the Elf event in December. She stated that the fundraising event received several donations and were able

to purchase 30 to 40 gifts for the Boulder City youths in need. Coordinator Brennan and Assistant Coordinator Beggs delivered the gifts on December 23. Coordinator Brennan gave a brief mechanical update explaining that the pumps were worked on and a new motor was needed.

Member Katie Tyler asked if the pool would be opening on Friday and Saturday again. Coordinator Brennan stated she would need approval from the EOC before they could re-open Friday and Saturday again. Coordinator Brennan stated, she is not sure if it can be justified to reopen at this point. Member Pontius asked how the cleaning is done in the facility and Coordinator Brennan stated that they wipe down and spray the surfaces 3x a day.

C. Verbal report from Parks and Recreation Director, Roger Hall, regarding the Municipal Ad Hoc Pool Committee

Manager Julie Calloway reported on this item for Director Hall stating the Municipal Pool Ad Hoc Committee is still in the process of obtaining information from a professional consultant for repairs of the existing facility along with a cost estimate for a new facility. She also explained that upcoming ballot questions have not been finalized.

5. For possible action: Verbal report from Director Roger Hall on mountain biking and the aerial trail system in Bootleg Canyon

Manager Julie Calloway presented Director Roger Hall's report on mountain biking and the aerial trail system in Bootleg Canyon. The report stated that Bootleg Canyon is a very popular place this time of year. We have had a few Mountain Bike races and they are following the Governors Guidelines. The Aerial Trail System is still closed. However, we did receive a call from Ian Green, owner of the Zipline, and he expressed interest in possibly opening back up in the spring. Member Morgan asked if there were any coyote issues in Bootleg Canyon and Manager Calloway explained that no coyote reports have been received from Bootleg Canyon.

6. For possible action: The Parks and Recreation Commission Reports concerning facilities, maintenance issues, various operations, and community events

Manager Calloway shared information about the recent pool pump troubleshooting and repairs. She also informed the members that a Big Horn Sheep Sculpture was donated to the Municipal Golf Course and is located at the entrance of the parking lot.

### Administration

\*We promoted two lifeguards to Head Lifeguard status. This position assists in scheduling of lifeguard staff, planning and conducting lifeguard in-services, provides leadership and guidance to lifeguard personnel, among other tasks

\*As noted in the Class section, we held a full Lifeguarding course in April with 5 students, all of whom we hope to hire for the City
