

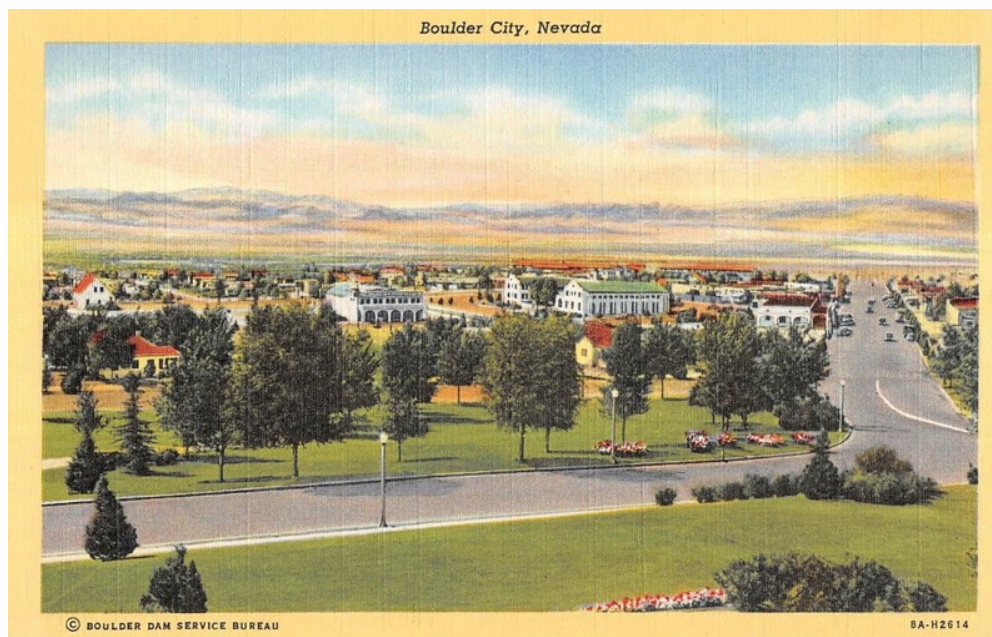

SNWA Raises Rates, Pass-through Charges

Changes to be reflected in July 2022 Billing



The Southern Nevada Water Authority's (SNWA) Infrastructure Charge paid by all customers is increasing to help fund water supply projects, water infrastructure improvements and conservation projects for Southern Nevada. The rate increase was recommended by an SNWA citizens advisory committee, Integrated Resource Planning Advisory Committee [IRPAC]), through a public process conducted in 2019-2020. In 2021, high inflation rates required re-evaluation of the previously approved January 2022 rate increase to ensure future funding goals related to IRPAC recommendations were met. As a result, the IRPAC reconvened in December 2021, and recommended an inflationary increase. The SNWA Board approved this increase to the SNWA's Infrastructure Charge to take effect March 2022, although Boulder City customers will not see the increase until

July 1, 2022. The pass-through SNWA monthly charge will increase from \$12.42 a month to \$14.21 per month starting in July. Most Boulder City residential customers monthly water bills will increase by approximately \$1.79. This does not include increases to commodity (per gallon) rates or rates for non-residential customers. Visit [snwa.com](https://www.snwa.com) for more information.

How should Boulder City Invest ARPA dollars? Share your Ideas!



Boulder City is the recipient of \$21.7 million from the American Rescue Plan Act. This one-time funding is meant to help communities recover from the COVID pandemic. The City must spend \$11,773,790 on ARPA-approved expenditures (e.g. water/wastewater infrastructure, pandemic response, supporting non-profits, small businesses, premium pay, etc.). The City can spend \$10 million in any way under the streamlined revenue loss provision.

While there are limitations on the ARPA-approved expenditures, we want to hear your thoughts and ideas.
