Boulder City is upgrading the way staff issues meeting agendas, packets and posts videos. The OneMeeting Agenda system allows residents to get everything they need in one stop. This portal allows residents to access City meeting documents quickly and easily, and enhances your involvement by providing access to video streaming. No more searching through hours of video for items of interest: you can look up archived agendas, click on the item you want and watch that portion of the meeting as it streams to your device! For staff, the new system allows for a more efficient workflow, minimizing errors and letting staff update and publish agenda packages with a single click.

## Water Conservation, Waste Changes Effective Soon



Keeping Lake Mead healthy is critical during this historic drought. Boulder City is committed to doing its part. Several ordinance and code changes go into effect on January 1, 2023. Violations include allowing water to continuously flow into the gutter, street, sidewalk, etc. and failing to repair leaks, irrigation system, or supply lines. New pool construction is limited to 600 sq. ft., and must drain into a drainage port. Residential properties, businesses, HOAs and multifamily properties are encouraged to take part in several SNWA rebate programs. When you replace non-functional grass, you may be eligible to get \$3 per square foot of grass you remove and replace with desert landscaping.
