New Utilities Director Brings Experience, Expertise

BOULDER CITY – Boulder City welcomes Dennis Porter as Utilities Director today. Dennis starts in the new role after a lengthy regional and national search. He is an experienced, highly recommended Director and Administrator with over 30 years of executive leadership responsibility, including oversight of multimillion-dollar operations for three large water utility organizations.

“Utilities Director is one of the most prominent positions on the City’s leadership team,” said Al Noyola, City Manager. “Dennis comes with outstanding experience in much larger communities and we are thrilled to have him on our team. We look forward to his insight and expertise on utilities management.”

Dennis holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from New Mexico State University. He is a registered Professional Engineer in Nevada, Arizona and South Carolina, and is a former Colorado River Water Users Association Trustee, a Former WaterReuse Association Board Member, an American Water Works Association Member and a Water Environment Federation Member. “Water is a vital interest in southern Nevada,” Dennis said. “I’ve spent the past three decades looking at best practices and I’m committed to bringing that experience to Boulder City.”

The hire comes four months after Council passed a measure to create the new utility department, removing duties from the public works department oversight. The department focuses on planning, maintenance and operations of water, wastewater, electrical and landfill.

Dennis worked as Assistant Director of Water Services for Phoenix, AZ, where he was responsible for leadership and oversight of the city’s wastewater treatment and reclaimed water systems, a water reclamation plant, and over 5,000 miles of sewer lines. Other roles include the Chief Operations Officer/Chief Administration Officer for Greenville Water in Greenville, SC and Director of Utility Services for the City of Henderson.
