Aquatic Center Ballot Questions 2019

The current pool is forty years old and has reached a critical point. In order to offer the programs that the community has come to appreciate, to keep up with current health code and to be compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements, city staff has proposed a new facility with modern technology. The design selected by focus groups includes a main pool and a programming pool.

On June 11, 2019, Boulder City Voters will face two questions regarding a new aquatic center:

1. Do you approve the City spending \$5 million dollars from the Capital Improvement Fund to design and construct a new aquatic center, reducing the bond obligation (the amount of bonds needed for the project)?

The Parks and Public Works Departments are working with the Communications Manager and SH Architecture to create a webpage where residents can learn about the proposals regarding the pool. Information will include a “Frequently Asked Questions” page, images of the current pool, conceptual designs of the proposed facility, videos, a breakdown of costs tied to the new facility and more. The page is scheduled to go live on February 7. The

City will issue a news release once the site is live and available for viewing.
