BC to Take Part in the World's Largest Swimming Lesson™!

On Thursday, June 20, 2019, Boulder City youth and adults will join tens of thousands of swimmers at



aquatic facilities around the world for the ninth year in a row to make noise that Swimming Lessons Save Lives.™ The World's Largest Swimming Lesson™ (WLSL), will take place over the course of 24 hours at an estimated 600 locations in more than 20 countries. Since its inception, more than 278,000 children and adults have participated in WLSL lessons generating more than a BILLION media impressions about the vital importance of learning to swim. The 2018 WLSL event included 41,814 participants from 27 countries. Tragically in the U.S., drowning remains the leading cause of unintended, injury related death for children ages 1 to 4, and the second leading cause of accidental death for children under 14. Research shows participation in formal swimming lessons can reduce the risk of drowning by 88% among children ages 1 to 4, yet many kids do not receive formal swimming or water safety training.
