Police gear up for seat belt-awareness campaign

Motorists in the Boulder City area could get a costly reminder of the importance of using seat belts when local law enforcement agencies, including the Boulder City Police Department, participate in the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) national **Click It or Ticket** high-visibility enforcement effort. Although the campaign will run from May 20 to June 2, 2019, the effort is designed to increase awareness of the importance of seat belt use throughout the year. Since the opening of I-11 in August 2018, Boulder City has seen an increase in the number of speeders and in seat-belt violations. Participating law enforcement agencies will take a no-excuses approach to seat belt law enforcement, writing citations day and night during the **Click it or Ticket** period.
