**Boulder City Parkway Complete Street Project Begins Monday**

**BOULDER CITY** – Phase I of the Boulder City Parkway Complete Street Project is scheduled to begin August 19. The project will add landscaped medians, new sidewalks, curbs and gutters, pedestrian crossings and more to a stretch of the Parkway between Veterans Memorial Drive and Buchanan Boulevard.

The project is expected to cost \$17,522,439, which includes design, construction and construction administration. The Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada, Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) and the City of Boulder City are funding the project.

Boulder City will pay \$596,780 to remove and replace an aged section of the sewer main and replace water services, as well install new fire hydrants along the route. The City also will be responsible for any additional costs for amenities such as bike racks, benches and trash cans.

To honor the work and the workers that made the construction of Hoover Dam possible, the City will include an artistic tribute as part of the renovations. Eight larger-than-life metal sculptures, depicting the life of dam workers in the 1930s, will be installed in the Parkway's median between Veterans Memorial Drive and Gingerwood Street. The sculptures will be similar to those that adorn the nearby I-11 and US-95 interchange.

The forms were chosen to represent people carrying their tools walking from Boulder City to work at the dam in the 1930s, with one exception. Included among the Parkway sculptures will be the Hoover Dam mascot known as "Nobody's Dog and Everybody's Dog," the Labrador-mix puppy that was born in the crawlspace beneath a building in Boulder City and had free run of the community. It quickly became a favorite of the workers, earning it a place in dam lore and among the sculptures.
