\$17.5 Million Boulder City Parkway Project Kicks Off Today

Phase 1 of the Boulder City Parkway Complete Street Project is scheduled to begin today. The project will add landscaped medians, new sidewalks, curbs and gutters, pedestrian crossings and more to a stretch of the Parkway between Veterans Memorial Drive and Buchanan Boulevard.

The project is expected to cost \$17,522,439, which includes design, construction and construction administration. The Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada, Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) and the City of Boulder City are funding the project.

Boulder City will pay \$596,780 to remove and replace an aged section of the sewer main and replace water services, as well install new fire hydrants along the route.



Within the next 10 months, this view of the Boulder City Parkway is going to change drastically.

Presentation Highlights Efforts of Community Development Staff

The Boulder City Community Development Department, in its annual report to the City Council, shared organization accomplishments, plans for the next year and an update on the I-11 impact. Community Development Director Michael Mays delivered a list of achievements during the August 13 City Council meeting.

- In 2018, the department saw significant increases in permits issued, inspections and revenue due to solar projects.
- In an effort to improve public transparency and customer convenience, the department will scan all building permits for easy online access, fulfilling of one of the City's 2025 Strategic Plan goals: the City is in compliance with the Growth Control Ordinance.
- Since the hiring of the Economic Development Coordinator, he has visited with over 160 local businesses and conducted 105 business retention visits.
- The City is promoting RDA (Redevelopment Agency) grant opportunities and has seen a significant increase in participation by local businesses.
- Over the next year the department will improve customer service with enhancements to the building permit process and inspections, making it easier for the customer to know the status of building inspections through online reporting and scheduling.

Fisher Space Pen Day Celebrated in Boulder City

At its meeting that night, the City Council and staff congratulated Fisher Space Pen Company for the 50th anniversary of the Space Pen being used on the Apollo 11 Moon Landing Mission and for the recent visit to Washington, D.C. for the third annual Made in America Product Showcase.

The company, founded by Paul Fisher in 1948, has called Boulder City home since 1976.
