Boulder City Welcomes New Deputy Fire Chief, Police Officer



Boulder City Fire Department (BCFD) has been extremely busy through the COVID-19 pandemic. Last week, a new Deputy Fire Chief joined the team: Greg Chesser. Deputy Chief Chesser has more than 34 years of experience in fire service, with more than two decades in management. He has served as a firefighter, training officer, assistant fire chief in prevention, assistant operations chief, and as a fire chief for the U.S. Air Force. He holds an MBA in Public Administration from Columbia Southern University in Orange Beach, Alabama. As Assistant Fire Chief Operations for the F. E. Warren Air Force Base in Wyoming, he managed 44 line firefighters and an Emergency Communications Center with five personnel. The position was approved in the FY2021 budget in May 2020 and confirmed during the June 23, 2020 City Council meeting. He officially started working with the department on July 15, 2020. "I've been living in Clark County since the beginning of the year and currently looking to make my home here in Boulder City," Deputy Chief Chesser said. "I have met the team working at BCFD, and I look forward to being a part of the team. I feel that Chief Gray and I, working together, can do great things to strengthen the response and efforts of the department."



Boulder City Officer Anil Sharma was sworn in last week before City Council. He started as an explorer for the Boulder City Police Department and was hired last year, just before starting the training academy. "I am excited to become a part of the community in Boulder City. There is a trust between the residents of Boulder City and the officers that serve the community, and that bond is one I hope to continue to strengthen," said Officer Sharma. A native of California, Officer Sharma has been living in Clark County for over a decade. His parents are immigrants from India and he is a first generation U.S. citizen. "My parents came in search of the American Dream, and through their success, I decided to give back and serve as an officer," Officer Sharma added. "I enjoy talking to people and this career gives me the opportunity to meet so many new people and make a positive impact."
