“Statewide Pause” Closes City Hall to Public, Limits Activities

BOULDER CITY – Mayor Kiernan McManus, City Council, the Acting City Manager and staff of Boulder City are working to protect our residents throughout the ongoing pandemic and recent surge in COVID-19 cases. The announcement of a Statewide Pause by Governor Steve Sisolak City led leaders to examine current operations, and how we can slow the spread of the virus. Going into effect on Wednesday, December 2, 2020, City offices will close to the public, in a similar manner as in March 2020.

- For Parks and Recreation activities that are allowed, participants and observers would need to follow State directives regarding occupancy and wear a mask

Essential City services will continue as scheduled. “Our Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is functioning; first responders are on duty and ready to provide aid if needed,” said Emergency Manager/Fire Chief William Gray. “Our biggest message is stay home. Stop the spread. If you are healthy and capable, call, email or talk to your neighbors and make sure they have food and supplies, especially if they live alone or are elderly.”

Acting City Manager Michael Mays reminds residents that information is updated regularly during these difficult times. “We have been providing information and links at www.bcnv.org/COVID-19 to keep residents updated about programs that can help - everything from testing to financial assistance to mental health resources,” said Mays. “Boulder City has always been a strong community and we will get through this together.”
