**Swim-A-Thon Benefits Boulder City's Residents in Need**

**BOULDER CITY** – Swimmers from Boulder City freestyled, backstroked, and butterflyed for Emergency Aid of Boulder City on March 13. The 2021 Swim-a-Thon included 11 swimmers completed a total of 33,250 meters—the equivalent of 20.66 miles – while raising \$866.25.

Swimmers included six youth from Boulder City Henderson (BCH) Heatwave Swim Team and five adults. One teen, Canyon Lenon, swam the greatest distance (7,000 meters) and brought in the greatest amount in donations: \$220.00! Other notable fundraisers were Valerie McNay, who completed 1,650 meters and raised \$201.00, and Nancy Palmer, who completed 2750 meters and raised \$200.00.

“The event had fewer participants this year, partially due to the COVID-19 State guidance limiting occupancy,” said Cheree Brennan, Aquatic Coordinator. “We still had a great time and lots of community support. We hope to hold another event in 2022 and bring back the larger groups we had in 2020.” (Last year before the pandemic shutdown, 11 participants raised over \$2,000.) Volunteers Michele Scheimer (former Aquatic Center employee) and Katie Tyler (BCH Swim Coach) counted laps during the event.
